FOREIGN LANGUAGE 0-9 hrs.
*Any student who matriculated **before Fall 2003** must demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language through the **102 level**. Any student who begins a degree program at Geneseo or elsewhere **in or after Fall 2003** must demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language through the **201 level**. Students may demonstrate proficiency in the following ways:*

Proficiency through the 102 level:

- ___Four units of high school foreign language (i.e., completion of a high school language sequence through Level IV, one year beyond the Regents Examination) **and** a score of 85 or above on the Regents Examination.
- ___A score of 3 or above on the Advanced Placement Examination in a foreign language.
- ___Placement above the 102 level on Geneseo's language placement examination. (This examination may be taken during Orientation or on the first day of Fall semester.)
- ___Completion of college-level coursework in a foreign language (at Geneseo or another institution) through the 102 (second semester, elementary) level.

Proficiency through the 201 level:

- ___Four units of high school foreign language (i.e., completion of a high school language sequence through Level IV, one year beyond the Regents Examination) **and** a score of 85 or above on the Regents Examination.
- ___A score of 4 or 5 on the Advanced Placement Examination in a foreign language.
- ___Placement above the 201 level on Geneseo's language placement examination. (This examination may be taken during Orientation or on the first day of Fall semester.)
- ___Completion of college-level coursework in a foreign language (at Geneseo or another institution) through the 201 (first semester, intermediate) level.
